Our Students

Therapeutic Day School

Special education (ED, SLD, S/L, ID, OHI, AUT, TBI) students (aged 6 to 21) are placed by their local school districts following the determination that the student's needs could not be met by their home school district programs and support services.

Diagnostic Program

A 60 school day program designed to assess a student's academic and social/emotional support needs. Student observations and formal assessments, across special education domains, are conducted within our structured and therapeutic school setting.

Interim Alternative Education Setting(IAES)

A 45 school day program designed to provide an alternative environment for special education students to access education and related services in lieu of expulsion.

Extended Day Program

Program available for when a student's special educational team has recommended need for additional structured therapeutic programming after school hours.
